¹There may be third party rights IF:

- Any components (DNA construct, parental mouse strain, gene insert, etc.) obtained from outside of the providing PI's lab, and they remain incorporated within the material.
- Any funds (for salaries and materials) from for-profit companies were used to support the generation or collection of the material.
- Individuals involved with the generation of the material had a consulting relationship with a company under which the generation of the material might fall.
- There were other agreements (such as incoming MTAs, sponsored research agreements, CDAs, etc.) that may be relevant to the generation of this material.
